

## PHYSICAL EDUCATION

#### K-5

We are thrilled to share that our students have completed an exciting basketball unit in Physical Education class! We learned essential basketball skills while developing teamwork, sportsmanship, and a love for physical activity.

Students practiced dribbling, passing, shooting, and defensive techniques. Our goal is to help each child improve their skills, regardless of their initial experience level.

Basketball is a wonderful way for students to learn the importance of working together. Through team drills and games, they will develop communication and collaboration skills.

Our basketball unit emphasizes having fun while staying active. We encourage students to enjoy the process of learning and to explore the joy of playing sports.

### PENGUINS ON ICE (K)

Our kindergarten artists created winter scenes featuring penguins in their icy habitat. This project introduced our students to a wide variety of skills, including painting, tearing, cutting, and collage. On the first day, our artists mixed white and blue paint to create a light blue background. Next, they painted simple penguins using basic shapes—an oval for the body, a circle for the head, and two lines for wings. We tore white paper to create snow and ice, cut out our painted penguins, and added details like orange beaks and white bellies to bring our penguins to life! Each step built on the last, giving students the opportunity to experiment with materials and practice new techniques.



Before creating their penguin collages, our students read Sky Color by Peter H. Reynolds, and explored how the sky can appear in many different colors. Using this inspiration, they began by painting vibrant backgrounds. Following this step, we created their penguins by breaking them down into simple shapes, drawing each part, cutting them out, and assembling them as a collage. To make each penguin unique, artists added details like scarves, hats, earmuffs, and mittens! In the final step, we attached their penguins to their backgrounds and used white oil pastel to create falling snow, completing their winter scenes.





### WINTER LANDSCAPES

Our 4th and 5th graders explored landscape art by creating winter scenes with depth and texture. We began by drawing a horizon line and blending colors to paint a unique, vibrant sky. On a separate sheet, we used a technique called "paint and scrape" to create the rough texture of birch tree bark—artists accomplished this by dragging a piece of cardboard through wet paint to mimic a natural pattern. Once our trees were dry, we carefully cut them out and collaged them onto their backgrounds. To add dimension, artists shaded the base of the trees and sprinkled in snowy details, bringing our winter landscapes to life.
